New church porch gates



The churchwardens of St Mary's have expressed their thanks and delight that donations from parishioners have now paid for the church's new south porch gates, illustrated above.

The gates, which replaced a "temporary" predecessor in place for 25 years, were commissioned from Rob Bowyer of Warwick Hill as the church's Diamond Jubilee project. Crafted in oak, they are not locked, but serve chiefly to keep birds out of the porch.

At the same time the gravel pathway from the road to the porch, and on to the park gate, has been relaid. The churchyard itself was given its annual makeover by a work party of volunteers in March.

The new rector of St Mary's, the Rev Rachel Lewis, is now in office, having been inducted at a service at St Mary's, Kintbury, on Wednesday 21st March. She has moved into Enborne Rectory.

Holtwood kennels plan turned down

The planning application to establish an extensive dog-breeding establishment at Rickety Gate Farm has been refused by West Berkshire Council.

Rachel Paul, owner of the 2.4 acre site, wanted to relocate from Old Burghclere the breeding kennels known as Shadowsquad, set up by her mother in the 1950s. She was seeking to build accomodation for an estimated 50 dogs, and a temporary residence for staff.

The application drew hostile reaction from residents of Holtwood and Gore End, who sent 49 letters of objection to WBC expressing concerns about noise, traffic, waste disposal, light pollution, animal welfare and the intrusion of new residential accomodation on a greenfield site. Hamstead Marshall Parish Council objected (with reference to the Village Design Statement), as did the CPRE, North Wessex Downs AONB, WBC highways department and the RSPCA.

Five letters of support were submitted, one of which contained a petition with 64 signatures. Supporters included retired police and prison

The council's refusal cited the Local Plan and the AONB, in which there is a presumption against new residential accommodation outside settlement boundaries. The application was said to have submitted insufficient information with regard to noise mitigation and odour control. Proposed staffing levels were also queried.
