

Biofuel project moves forward

The woodfuel heating project launched by the Organic Research Centre (ORC) at Elm Farm earlier this year moves forward with the creation of the **Hamstead Marshall Sustainable Energy Group** which, now that ORC has gone firm on switching to biofuel for its own heating, will investigate the feasibility of extending the project to embrace the local community.

The group's membership comprises Sally Westaway, Jo Smith and Mary Crossland from ORC, and Robin Tandy (chairman), Matthew Prince and Katie Wallis from the village. In early September this group is making a two-day visit to Marburg, in central Germany, to attend a conference at Philipps University, and to visit bio-energy villages* in the area. The overall project, which is funding the visit, has been supported by the Ashden Trust and has received European Regional Development Funding through INTERREG IVB. Meanwhile, Sally Westaway has written to all households which have expressed interest in the project, announcing a more detailed feasibility study into, among other things, the costs of connecting individual properties. This stage of the project is to be carrried out this coming winter. The households immediately around Elm Farm (and therefore likely to be the first phase of expanding the scheme into the community) have been designated into groups 1, 2, 3 and 4, according to forecast connection costs. Estimated fuel savings per group range from £5,700 to £9,000 per annum, and the payback period from six to nine years.



Changes at church

The Walbury Beacon benefice, to which Hamstead St Mary's belongs, bids farewell to two of its clergy team this autumn: the Rev Cathy Pynn, who joined at Easter 2006, retired with her husband to their family home near Reading at the end of August, and the Rev James Cook, who has served in the benefice since June 2010, is moving with his wife Suzanne to a parish on the Isle of Wight in October. Both were house-for-duty priests, ie, part-time, and the benefice will be advertising for replacement clergy to work with the team.

At the same time, services in all six of the benefice churches (Hamstead Marshall, Enborne, West Woodhay, Combe, Inpken and Kintbury) are under review. Each parochial church council has nominated two representatives to examine all the options and submit proposals in September.

"Church services can take many forms," says the Rev Rachel Lewis, "including family service, songs of praise, evensong or matins. Not everything has to be a communion service. We want to make sure that our worship pattern reflects what people want to come to, so we're asking people to let us know."

The second attempt to get planning permission for a dog-breeding farm at **Rickety Gate Farm** in Holtwood has met with refusal from WBC, much to the delight of local residents who protested en masse about such a project's potential for noise, pollution, extra traffic and general nuisance in a quiet rural area. The WBC planning website records no known appeal against the decision as yet, but it is widely assumed to be the longer-term purpose behind an application which was so similar to the first.

In August WBC highways department installed a second chevron bend warning sign at **Chapel Corner**, together with some additional reflective poles on the grass island. This, in addition to earlier resurfacing work, will, it is hoped, lessen the frequency of crashes by speeding motorists.

I N New doors on the **Chapel Corner noticeboard**, installed by the parish council a few months ago, have already come loose and seem likely to go the way of the last pair (ie, falling out into the road). The problem lies not with the doors themselves, but with the wooden grooves along which they slide.

The fire brigade was called out on Friday 2nd August in response to a call from Hamstead Marshall to free a woman from a locked bedroom.

According to the Guardian of 27th August 2013, **Anthony Stansfeld**, who is both Hamstead Marshall's WBC councillor and Thames Valley Police Crime Commissioner, has cut nearly £600,000 from the Thames Valley Police budget.

Several **ORC Elm Farm** land sales are going through, but details are not yet available because some have yet to complete.

The **Elm Farm Trail** has three new guide leaflets. One maps the trail itself, marking points of interest on route, such as pollarded willows, old clay pits and historic hedge lines (and seats for weary walkers). Two others are aimed at 10 to 15 year-olds, entitled the Farm Trail Explorer, posing questions and answers. Copies of the leaflets can be obtained from ORC, or from leaflet boxes along the trail itself.

The Walbury Computer Group
