What's new at the village hall?









The Montessori school has moved on, but there's still plenty happening.

On Sunday 9th September there will be a **showcase celebration of the creative skills of the Circle of Friends and their partners**, organised by Anne Budd, displaying skills such as sculpture, art-work, knitting, needlework, sugarcraft, fabric design, quilting, photography, and woodcraft. Entrance is free (with a small charge for refreshments) and opens from 2 to 4.30pm.

Young Farmers is a youth group affiliated to the National Federation of Young Farmers. It currently has 20 members, with ages ranging between 10 and 26, and they meet on alternate Wednesdays. If you're interested in joining (no requirement to be a farmer) contact <u>Emma Collins</u>.

Ruth Tsoi's mini-professors science classes are fun, interactive sessions for pre-schoolers and their parents. With hands-on experiments, stories and videos based on 80 varied topics you and your child will be taken on a scientific adventure. On Monday mornings Ruth runs two separate sessions (10.00 for 2 to 3.5 year olds and 11.00 for 3 to 5 year olds), and the monthly Saturday sessions (09.30 and 10.30) are for mixed ages (2 to 5 years) to enable siblings to attend together.

Chris Allen is holding **two woodworking Sundays** between now and Christmas. October is now fully booked but 18th November still has places. <u>Email</u> him or ring 07899 907448 for details.

The **Harvest Supper**, once a staple of the village calendar, lapsed some years ago, but is being revived for 29th September this year. Helpers are being sought to make the food, and to supply raffle prizes. Contact <u>Sue Watts</u> (01488 658932).

The now traditional village **bonfire night party and fireworks** takes place on 5th November, with a massive blaze, the guy competition, refreshments and spectacular pyrotechnics. Entry is free but there will be a collection for a nominated charity.

The **Circle of Friends** gathers at the hall on the evening of the first Thursday of each month to hear a speaker or watch a demonstration. There's no membership, nor any need to book. Entrance is \pounds_3 to cover refreshments.

Enborne & Hamstead Marshall Garden Society meets at the village hall several times a year for talks and demonstrations and, at this time of year, for its AGM in November. The society is keen to find more members, but you can attend meetings as a guest to sample its delights.

And of course the **community market** brings together neighbours and supporters from further afield each month to buy artisan bread, Lanie's preserves, crafts, books and Sue's delicious cakes. This year's Christmas special on Saturday 8th December will be at Elm Farm.

The **mobile library** visits the village hall every third Thursday, from 10.20 to 11am. Autumn dates are 20th September, 11th October, 1st and 29th November, and 20th December.

It is hoped that another **Village Pub Night** can be arranged before Christmas.

18/00917/LBC2 validated 27th Mar 2018: Replacement windows and doors, refurbishment of retained windows and doors, replacement roof coverings. New fascia board and soffit. Replacement rainwater goods. Acoustic upgrade to compartment floor. Exterior decoration. Waterproofing works to tunnel below flats 5 and 6. Approved 15th Jun 2018.

East Gate House RG20 oJD

18/01129/HOUSE validated 20th April 2018: Demolition of existing ground floor living space and erection of a new enlarged living space. All listed elements will not be affected. Refused 17th Aug 2018 on grounds: "The dwelling is set within a Grade I listed wall and located very close to Grade I listed piers. The proposed extension would, by virtue of its siting block sight lines and views of the gateway from inside the garden toward the piers and wall. It would permanently block the historic vista through the garden courtyard. This will therefore detract from the significance of the surviving Grade I listed wall and piers and the inclusion of the site within the Grade II registered park and garden."

Brunsden Associates are offering a five-bedroom granary and barn conversion with two-and-threequarter acres on Watery Lane in Holtwood. The guide price is £1,100,000. (This appears to be unrelated to the current planning application for another barn conversion in Watery Lane.)

What's happening with Village hall gets the White Hart?

Following the planning inspector's dismissal (see the full report) of Stella Coulthurst's appeal against WBC's rejection of her application to turn the White Hart into four dwellings, the pub appears to still be on the leasehold market with Christie & Co.

Until recently the agent's page described the pub as "under offer", but enquiries by the Hornet to both Christie and Stella Coulthurst remain unanswered.

Memorials digitised

Hamstead St Mary's churchyard contains many memorials, the oldest of which is dated 1666. In 1929 a handwritten transcription of all the inscriptions was made, but this work was not widely circulated, and it is now well out of date.

This summer volunteers from **Berkshire Family** History Society have been at work checking and updating the 1929 work. When complete it will be published as an indexed CD, with photos, on sale from the society. The same group completed a similar project for Enborne St Michael's churchyard last year.

a summer brush-up...

The village hall has had an interior repaint of magnolia on the walls, and a new colour on the woodwork. There are new curtains on the side windows, and the curtains on the big north window have been cleaned.

A new display is planned for the history board.

... and a status upgrade?

Parish councillor Anne Budd is seeking to obtain Asset of Community Value status for the hall.

ACVs can be land or buildings nominated by a local group and which the local council decides further the social wellbeing or social interests of the local community. Historic interest is not a factor, although the former village school has this attribute as well.

Since the departure of Jane's House Montessori the village hall has daytime availability Tuesdays to Fridays. Anyone interested should contact Sue Watts (01488 658932).

Where have Hamstead's booklovers gone?

Figures recently released by WBC show a startling drop in usage of Hamstead's mobile library service.

In 2015-16 12 Hamstead residents made use of the service, registering 640 loans. The following year that halved to 312 loans, and the most recent year (2017-18) dropped further, to 157, accounted for by just seven local borrowers. WBC confirms that these figures are correct.

Whilst the library's ports of call in Hamstead have been cut back from two to one, and from alternate Thursdays to every third Thursday, this alone surely cannot account for such a precipitous drop.

Given the current climate of service cuts it surely cannot be long before the service to Hamstead comes under threat.

The mobile library calls at the village hall every third Thursday (20th September, 11th October, 1st and 29th November, and 20th December) from 10.20-11.00. Use it or lose it.

WBC also operates an At Home service, through which volunteers collect and deliver library books for housebound parishioners. According to the statistics 69 such loans were made to Hamstead last year.
